

LAZARUS GARDEN FAQs

What is the vision of the Lazarus Garden?

The Lazarus Garden has two primary purposes: to provide the local community a place to grow their own food and to help feed the hungry in the community through donations to the Delaware Township Food Bank.

Where is the garden located?

The garden is located on the east side of the church property, located at 10500 E. 126th St., Fishers.

What plot sizes are available?

8X16 ground beds and 4X9 raised beds
4X2.5 raised wheelchair accessible beds - limited availability

What do the plots cost?

Community plots are at no cost. You are encouraged to donate a portion of your harvest to the local food bank. Donations are collected at the church in a Rubbermaid container marked Lazarus Garden Food Donations by the Café entrance, which is the entrance closest to the garden. Donations are delivered to the Delaware Township Food Bank on Monday afternoons.

Is there a water source on site?

Yes, there is a well and watering system. Please make sure you conserve water and turn it off when you are done.

When is the garden open?

The garden is open from dawn to dusk.

Can I bring my dog to the garden with me?

No, please do not bring pets to the garden.

Can I use mulch and pesticides?

Yes. Organic mulches (compost, leaves, straw, etc.) and organic pesticides, if used, are encouraged. Please be considerate of the gardens around you.

Who will weed my plot?

You are responsible for weeding and general upkeep of your plot and the walkway around it.

Will there be compost bins?

Yes, compost bins will be placed near the garden with instructions as to what can be placed in them.
